I am sure we are all going to get fed up with the hype behind the year '2020'. I know that more people know about us, more people have visited us and we understand a little more about the affection in which the building is held by many locally. That gives us lots to work upon but as we all know we will need to start any thinking by praying first. For as we come to the end of 2019 (and for the last time for a while!)
